Absenteeism

Any boy who arrives late must report to the office. If your son is absent, kindly inform the office by 08:00. Please provide a note on his return or, if he has been off school for three days or more, a doctor's certificate. Boys who are absent on a Friday may, at the coach's discretion, be considered for Saturday matches.

Please note that the Headmaster must be timeously notified, via email, of any leave of absence holiday, leave to attend a family function or missing a compulsory school event etc. Such leave of absence is viewed seriously and should only be requested in exceptional circumstances.

Absent from Sport

Please advise the school office telephonically (021 761 8074), if your son will be absent from sport as a result of illness or injury. Any request for absence during school time must be made in writing.

When off games, a note to the class teacher is essential. We cannot excuse a child from sport unless we have a written request from the parent; this includes class games.

Accounts

School fees and extras are to be paid in full within the first ten days of the start of the new term. These may be paid directly into the school's bank account at First National Bank, Claremont (branch code 200109, account number 50152664890) or by cheque directly to the school, for the attention of the Business Manager. A surcharge will be levied on late payments received. For security purposes, no cash will be accepted at the school. Deposit slips are to be faxed to 021 762 6120 or e-mailed to dreyer@wpps.org.za.

Afternoon Activities

Please do not overload your son. Tears are a sure sign that your son is doing too much. If this happens, review his programme and speak to his class teacher immediately.

Arrival and Departure

We encourage parents to stop-and-drop their sons. There are two gates through which the pupils are allowed to enter the school grounds:

- Gate 2 in Eyton Road
- Gate 7 in Riviera Road

In the interests of safety, and in order to cause the least disruption to traffic in Eyton Road, we ask that you drop your son off and move your car as quickly as possible. In the afternoon, the same applies when collecting your son.

No pupil is allowed to cross Newlands Road except via the subway.

To avoid unnecessary anxiety, make sure your son knows exactly where you will fetch him after school. If you are going to be late, please advise the office by 12:00, so that we can inform your son in advance. Your son will wait for you in prep until you fetch him there. Prep is until 15:30.

Should your son need to leave school early for any reason, please notify both the office and the class teacher. All boys are to be collected from the office.

No pupil is allowed to wait alone on the pavement for his lift.

Art

We are fortunate to have an Art Room which is spacious, inspiring and well situated for the use of all the boys. Work is displayed throughout the year and is also exhibited at our Evening of the Arts.

Boys who are particularly interested in art may join an Art Club, which enables them to spend extra time during the afternoon being creative. Extra pottery is also offered. During these lessons, a practising potter guides them and inspires them to create original three-dimensional clay models.

Assessment

Boys (Grades 3–7) are tested on a weekly basis and examinations (Grades 6 and 7) are written twice a year in June and November. A revision manual is published prior to the exams to assist boys in their planning and preparation. It is recommended that Grade 7 boys who have maintained an 80% aggregate apply for a scholarship to their prospective senior schools. Those who wish to sit these examinations, apply independently.

Birthdays

We still make a fuss of the birthday boy, who may come to school dressed in civies. If you wish to send something special for the class to help him celebrate his special day, please make it something easy to distribute. Please do not hand out invitations at school if you are inviting only a few boys to his party, as this can be hurtful.

Boarding

Barlow House caters for weekly boarders, but short-stay “hotel-boarding” is also available. The boys are under the care of the Housemaster, Mr Allan Wells. The boys enjoy a well-regulated, active life in the atmosphere of an extended family.

Board of Governors

The Board of Governors, in accordance with the WPPS Constitution, has representatives from the various constituencies, viz the parents, the teachers, St Andrew’s College, St John’s Parish (Anglican) and the school management. The Board’s main function is to consider and set policy for the operation of the school, and to ensure its financial health. The Board advises, guides and supports the Head who, with his management team and staff, is responsible for the day-to-day running of the school.

Boypost

Most communications are sent electronically and are available on the web. Any hard copy communications will be sent home on Fridays with the boys.

Bullying

We have a “zero tolerance” policy on bullying. Bullying is regarded as the deliberate intimidation or victimisation of an individual by another through, physical and/or psychological means.

Camps

Camps are an integral part of WPPS life. Grades 4 to 7 have two camps annually, in the first and fourth terms. These camps are a source of great enjoyment and learning, and are much-awaited highlights in the school year.

Chapel

Our chapel is a place of quiet and prayer for all members of the school community, as well as a meeting place for

Christian groups within the school. As WPPS is an Anglican school, school assembly always includes a hymn, Bible reading and prayer. A longer service of worship is held on Wednesday mornings for Grades 3 to 7 and on Thursdays for Grades 1 and 2. The choir takes an active part in the school's worship. The Christian faith is taught in Scripture classes, though in a manner respectful of and sensitive to boys of other faiths.

There are two SU Christian fellowship groups which offer lively encouragement to the boys in their faith. Prayer is an important part of the school life and, in addition to informal meetings of boys and staff to pray when particular needs arise, there is a regular parents' prayer group which meets every week to pray for the school family and community. The school's chaplain is Ben Aldous, who is available to the WPPS family to offer pastoral care.

Class Representatives

At the beginning of each year we call for volunteer class representatives. Two parents from each class take on the responsibility of co-ordinating the rest of the parents regarding practical assistance, which includes outings and fundraising events under the direction of the class rep facilitator. Meetings are held with the Head and the class rep facilitator at least once a term to discuss various issues. Class representatives play an important role as links between the school and parents. Their work is greatly appreciated.

Communication

Our primary means of communication is the weekly newsletter, which is posted on the web every Friday. The newsletter link is emailed, and is available for download on our website in the early afternoon. www.wpps.org.za

Cultural Activities and Clubs

We encourage boys' participation in cultural activities. The cultural programme is available on the web. Every two years, there is a cultural tour in which art, dance, drama and music play vital roles.

Dance and Drama

Drama affords the boys another opportunity to express themselves creatively and to use their language skills imaginatively. Dance is very popular with our senior boys, who are exposed to a variety of music/dance techniques (e.g. cha-cha, rock and roll, hip-hop and rap); they also have an opportunity to choreograph their own dances.

Discipline/Merits

Boys are expected to follow our *Code of Conduct* at all times. Theft, vandalism and bullying are regarded as extremely serious offences and may result in a pupil being asked to leave the school.

Detention may be given for unsatisfactory or incomplete work. This takes place between 13:45 and 14:45 on Fridays. Saturday afternoon detention is for more serious or cumulative misdemeanours, and is from 14:00–16:00.

Self-discipline is an integral part of a child's development. Merits are given in recognition of good work, task completion, good behaviour, helpfulness etc. There will be occasions, however, when we have to discipline negative behavior. We ask that you work alongside us in the best interests of your son.

Evening of the Arts

The Evening of the Arts is an annual celebration of the school's cultural side, expressed through art, creative writing, dance, drama and music. All our ensembles and the senior choir perform at these evenings.

Exchange – UK

Our Grade 6 boys are given the opportunity to apply to participate in an international exchange to a school in the UK. Details are posted during the course of the year.

Extramurals

Extramurals and paid extras are organised each year according to interest and staff availability. Summer/winter sport and cultural schedules explaining what is available are posted on the web.

Family Groups

Boys from Grades 1 to 7 are assigned to a family under the guidance of a staff member. We believe that these groups further the caring, compassion and mentoring between all our boys, and provide yet another avenue for support, discussion and belonging.

There are about 14 boys in each family, approximately two boys in each family per grade. The vertical nature of the groups allows older boys to help (and learn from) younger boys and to strengthen bonds between all boys at WPPS. Although minor changes will occur over a boy's career when older boys leave and younger ones arrive, the make-up of the family remains consistent over many years, allowing for very helpful and tangible bonds to develop between boys of all ages, and their assigned staff member.

Families meet on most Tuesday mornings where their 20-minute activity takes the form of discussion or group activities.

Hair

A boy's hair is expected to be neat and trim at all times. Extravagant styles (those which attract undue attention) are not allowed.

Hat/Cap

It is compulsory in the summer terms for your son to wear a WPPS cricket hat or cap during break times and during sport.

Homework

Each pupil is required to copy down his homework in a special homework diary every day. This must be signed once he has completed the tasks. A special time should be reserved for homework every day and a routine established to suit your individual needs. It helps to get the work done by 18:00. The diary is a good channel of communication between teacher and parent and must be signed daily, so that we know that we are in constant touch. At the back of the diary, you will find a sleeve in which notices are posted. Reply slips must be returned in the same envelope. Any money must be returned in a separate envelope, clearly marked, directly to the office.

Houses

From Grade 1, boys are put into one of four houses which compete against each other in sporting, cultural and academic activities. Staff are also allocated to houses and provide additional support to boys in their houses.

Hutchinson: (Red) named after Mr RW Hutchinson – a founder of WPPS.

De Villiers: (Blue) named after the Hon JE de Villiers.

Lasbrey: (Yellow) named after the Reverend EW Lasbrey.

Stansbury: (Green) named after Mr CG Stansbury – a founder of WPPS.

ICT

The ICT network at WPPS is a sophisticated one, allowing boys and staff access to some of the latest technology. Each boy from Grade 3 has his own Google account, which is provided to pupils once they have

signed our Acceptable Use Policy – allowing him to make use of email and cloud storage services. Our Foundation Phase teachers enhance teaching and learning in their classrooms using iPads, while our Intermediate Phase boys make use of Chromebooks in their lessons. Our skills -orientated ICT curriculum ensures that each boy is equipped with the tools needed to work in an ever-changing online environment, irrespective of the device used.

Information Centre/Library

Research skills are a part of general teaching practice from Grades 1 to 7. There is a wide range of literature available to accommodate all reading levels from Grades 3 to 7 in the Newlands Rd library. There is a comprehensive resource section which incorporates reference works and non-fiction.

Leadership

All boys in Grade 7 have the opportunity to be involved in a broad leadership programme, which includes mentoring, community service and personal development. They also complete a period of duty as monitors. At the end of the second term, the boys are assessed by their peers and the staff, and a group of permanent prefects is selected. The prefects oversee specific portfolios. The group of monitors meets weekly with their Housemaster, whilst the council of prefects meets weekly with the Head and/or a Deputy Head.

Lockers

Suitcases, music bags and sports bags must be kept in the lockers. Please do not allow your son bring toys to school.

Lost Property

Every item that the boys bring or wear to school must be clearly marked. The boys are responsible for retrieving their own articles from lost property. A charge of R7.50 per item is levied onto your school account. Unclaimed school clothing goes to the school shop at WPPS at the end of each term, and other unclaimed articles are given to charity.

Mentoring

This system is in place to provide another channel of communication and support where the boys can discuss issues that arise, either within a group, or on an individual basis.

Music

WPPS has a lively and active music department. Boys have the opportunity to play in music workshops, concerts and to enter external exams. Deserving boys will also have an opportunity to play in one or more of our music ensembles. These include the Junior Choir (Grades 1 to 3), Senior Choir (Grades 4 to 7), Junior String Orchestra, Senior String Orchestra, Junior Wind Band, Senior Wind Band, African Marimba Band, Percussion Ensemble and Guitar Ensemble. These ensembles rehearse weekly before school, during lunch breaks or after school. The following instruments are offered for tuition:

Grade 3: group recorder, piano, violin, cello, classical guitar, percussion, singing, baritone and trumpet

Grades 4 to 7: piano, violin, cello, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, baritone, euphonium, classical guitar, electric guitar, percussion, group African marimbas and singing. Boys who want to take singing lessons need to be or become members of one of the choirs. African marimbas are recommended as a second instrument, but not as a first instrument. Boys may do a maximum of two instruments and, depending on their schedules, they may add group marimbas.

Class Music

Grades 3 to 5 have class music lessons once a week. Class music involves music appreciation, and the development of pitch and rhythm using games, songs and Orff percussion instruments.

Concerts

Every second Monday, a music ensemble or soloist plays for the school in assembly, while the choirs regularly sing in chapel services. All music boys are encouraged to play in at least one of our intimate music workshops during the year, to gain valuable performance skills. We have junior and senior ensemble concerts once a year. This is where all of the school's ensembles and choir get to perform. Our Soloists' Music Concert is for our most advanced musicians. Boys of a grade three music level or higher audition to play in this prestigious concert. Our boys also have opportunities to perform outside of

school on a regular basis. Past festivals include: Rustenburg Arts and Cultural Festival, Artscape School Arts Festival, Southern Suburbs Choir Festival, and The NASSAU Choir Festival.

Tours

Almost every two years, the school embarks on a cultural or music tour.

Facilities

The Frances Crowson Recital Room is used for ensemble rehearsals, music workshops, class music, dance and drama. There are seven, generously-sized music teaching rooms and a percussion room which is well equipped with all the orchestral percussion instruments, two drum kits and seven African marimbas. The music department stays up to date with the latest solo and ensemble repertoire and with current music examination books. The school also owns a large selection of Orff instruments for class music. We have 11 upright pianos and 2 grand pianos.

Outings

At WPPS, we believe that it is important for children to develop an appreciation of our natural and urban environments. To this end we try, wherever possible, to create a link between what they learn in the classroom and the world beyond. Although lectures and plays often take place at school, outings give pupils a broader base than a classroom can provide.

Packed Lunches

No sweets, chips or tinned cooldrinks are allowed. A sturdy lunch box and a juice bottle, clearly marked, is the ideal way of sending a healthy lunch to school. These will be kept in his locker until break and replaced after use.

Plays

In the senior grades, interested boys have the opportunity to be involved in a dramatic production every second year.

Prep (Grades 4–7)

Supervised prep is offered Mondays to Thursdays from 14:30–15:30.

Prize Giving

The annual Prize Giving ceremony for Grades 3 to 7 is held on the last day of the school year. Awards are presented in recognition of academic achievement, cultural contributions and character. Sports awards are made during the relevant seasons. Citations for all awards are recorded in the annual school magazine. The Eden Road final assembly is also held on the last day of the year.

Punctuality

Boys should be at school before 07:30, at which time the first bell rings and all pupils go to their classrooms for a form period.

Pupil Support Department

A part-time and two full-time remedial teachers assist in identifying learning difficulties and, where necessary, an appropriate programme is devised. If required, a boy may be referred to a psychologist for a full psychometric assessment. On the Eden Rd Campus there are speech and occupational therapists. On the Newlands Rd Campus, we have teachers who come in to work with small groups of boys in the afternoons to support their learning, and a list of tutors whom we recommend should boys need individual tuition. A school counsellor is

available to help and advise pupils, and a consultant counsellor to assist families in need of further support. In addition, we have a play therapist who is able to help boys work through a variety of difficulties.

Report Backs (At Homes)

These are held during the course of the year on specified days for individual appointments with the relevant teachers. Should the need arise, parents are welcome to make appointments with staff, outside of the designated days and during school hours, to discuss areas of concern.

Reports

Grades 3 & 4: Reports are issued in terms two and four, and parents are offered the opportunity for individual parent interviews with teachers in terms one, two and three.

Grades 5 to 7: Full reports are issued in terms two and four. These comprise a detailed evaluation of all subjects studied, sport and cultural activities. The first and third term reports are single page assessments and the At Homes offer parents the opportunity to meet with teachers to discuss any areas of concern.

Sport

Apart from three playing fields, the school's sports facilities include seven cricket nets, a 20m x 25m water polo pool, an 8m x 20m junior pool, a judo hall and the use of local tennis courts and squash courts.

In summer, cricket, swimming, tennis and water polo are offered, and all boys participate in athletics. In winter, cross country, hockey, rugby and squash are available. The chosen sport for T1 and T4 is the same.

All boys from Grade 1 upwards are required to take part in at least two afternoons of school sport per week, winter and summer. They are also required to honour their commitments to their chosen sports for the entire season. Summer season – first and fourth terms; winter season – second and third terms. Class games are timetabled for Grades 3 to 5.

If sport (Grades 3 to 7) is cancelled due to wet weather, an sms is sent advising parents. Boys will be supervised until they are collected. Alternatively, your son can phone you from the public phone using a phone card, which can be bought at the office for R50.

Inter-House

All sporting codes have an inter-house element to them. These events usually occur towards the end of the season of that specific code. The four houses are Lasbrey, de Villiers, Stansbury and Hutchinson.

Inter-House Cross Country

The annual inter-house cross country takes place at the beautiful Klein Constantia Wine Farm in September. This is compulsory for all boys from Grades N – 7.

Standards Day

Is a school day set aside for Grades 3 to 7 to participate in all events, in order to test themselves against their peers within their respective houses.

Sports Day

The top performers at Standards Day from each house, represent their houses against the other three houses. This is a whole school event where boys compete for a trophy.

Sports Tours

The school participates in various sporting tours each year - hockey, rugby, cricket, squash and tennis.

Stationery

Each boy receives stationery which will be billed to the parents account. Books will be sent home to be covered in the first few days of the term. Each item is to be marked individually, as well as boxes/bags themselves; each item must be marked separately.

Sun Policy

WPPS has a Sun Policy which includes the following guidelines:

- When outside in sunny weather, boys are required to wear caps; "No cap, no play." or sit in the shade.
- Parents are to ensure that sunscreen has been applied to their sons in the morning before they are dropped off at school.
- Boys must provide their own sunscreen. The school offices on both campuses will maintain a stock of SPF 30 broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen for use in the event a boy forgets his own.
- Boys are encouraged by teachers to apply sunscreen before going to lunch and by coaches if at sport.

3. Other fee information

- Charges for extras, i.e. stationary, outings, camps, tours, etc., are invoices in arrears per term and must be settled with tuition fees.
- Electives charged to school fee accounts are Aftercare, Art Club, Lunch (excluding boarders), music and pupil support. These are invoiced in arrears per term and must be settled with the tuition fees.
- Overdue fees and charges will attract a surcharge at the prevailing prime overdraft rate +3%
- The school requires written notice of one full term of the intention to withdraw a pupil; otherwise one term's fees are in due in lieu of notice.

Boys are expected to arrive at, and leave school in full school uniform. During Term 3, boys are allowed to wear their school tracksuit pants during school hours. Please note, however, boys are to travel to and from school in full school uniform, and may only put on their tracksuit pants once they are at school.

After sport in winter, boys may go home in a full school tracksuit, socks and school shoes/white track shoes or shower and change into their uniform. In summer, they may go home in their sports clothes (a tracksuit for swimmers) or shower and change into their uniform.

Boys attending cultural activities must wear their uniform, and spectators at sports events must wear either uniform or their tracksuits.

Values

Every two weeks the school focuses on a specific value, eg consideration for others. This is reflected in assembly, chapel, class room and house meetings. Parents are asked to support the school by discussing the values with their sons and encouraging the practice thereof.

We endeavour to assist disadvantaged schools and U-Turn and there is a whole school, weekly sandwich/fruit collection on Wednesdays.

“Keep it clean. Keep it green.” WPPS has been awarded its Green Flag status. As an Eco-School, we endeavour to raise awareness of environmental issues and support sustainable activities in order to prepare our boys for their role in looking after our planet. We have an active recycling policy to deal with school waste and to facilitate the recycling of some household waste.

School waste: paper is the predominant recyclable product generated in school and each classroom has a recycling bin for that purpose. For glass and cans we have special wheelie bins – green for glass and orange for cans. These can be found outside the Centenary Pavilion and on the Eden Road Campus.
